Pre-Advising for Bama Bound Orientation

Use this sheet as a reference guide and **have it ready to use before registering at College Visit 2**. Please find descriptions of General Education courses in the [General Education Courses.pdf](#) included in Module 4 or our www.prehealth.ua.edu website. You can download this sheet to write on or type in your answers with the fillable form.

Health Professions students— depending on your math placement, plan to take one math, and one or two sciences. This may vary based on dual enrollment/AP/IB credit, so ask a pre-health advisor. Remaining courses should be taken in the minor (if applicable) and/or general education. Consider any special academic programs and write those down here.

To be considered a full-time student, you must enroll in a minimum of 12 credit hours. Tuition is the same for 12-16 credit hours. To graduate in 4 years without summer school classes, aim for 15-16 credit hours per semester.

When filling out this worksheet, refer to the [General Education Courses.pdf](#) included in Module 4 to see categories and descriptions of General Education (core) courses. Pick out options that look interesting to you, since any course listed in a category will fulfill that General Education (core) requirement.
